Rev. Marcus Kerry Barnett, 68, of McAlester died Dec. 13, 2006.

Marcus Kerry was born Aug. 13, 1938, in Chambers, Okla., to M.K. and Minnie C. Grubbs Barnett. He married Beverly Elaine Ingram on April 20, 1956.
